Bodies with law enforcement authorities and multiple purposes

- Hong Kong (Independent Commission Against Corruption)
- Singapore (Corrupted Practices Investigation Bureau)
- Lithuania (Lithuania's Special Investigative Service)

Law enforcement institutions

- **Specialized prosecution services**
 - Spain (Special Attorney General's Office for the Repression of Economic Offences Related with Corruption (ACPO))
 - Romania (National Anti-Corruption Directorate)
 - Croatia (Office for the Prevention and Suppression of Corruption and Organized Crime).
- **Specialized police services**
 - Belgium (Central Office for the Repression of Corruption)
 - Norway (Norwegian National Authority for Investigation and Prosecution of Economic and Environmental Crime)
 - United Kingdom (Metropolitan Police / Anti-corruption Command)
