- POSTERS AND PRESENTATIONS -

Requirements

- External post-graduate, Ph.D. and post-doc students and faculty are asked to prepare a poster and to present their latest research efforts and/or findings in a 10-15 minutes presentation. Both the poster and the presentation shall touch on (anti-) corruption issues.
- Other external participants are asked to prepare a poster and to present their organizations' anti-corruption efforts (e.g. anti-corruption strategies, anti-corruption projects...) in a 10-15 minutes presentation.
- External graduate students do not need to prepare a poster or presentation.

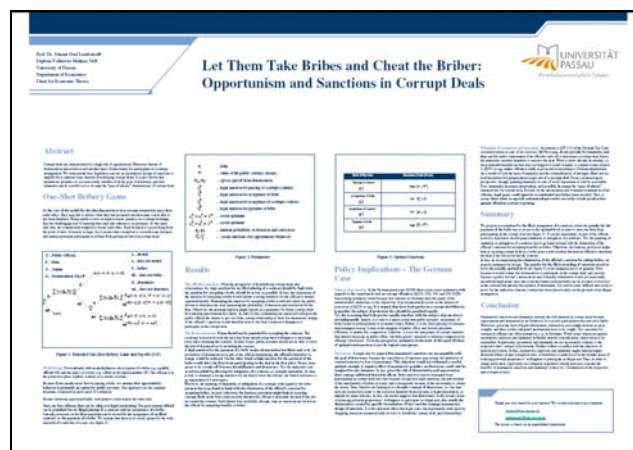
Posters

A poster is a static, visual medium (usually of the paper and board variety) that you use to communicate ideas and messages. The difference between poster and oral presentations is that you should let your poster do most of the 'talking'; that is, the material presented should convey the essence of your message.

Formatting: Din A2, A1, A0.

Texts and graphics should be easily readable (no handwriting; minimum font size: 20pt).

- Duration: 10-15 minutes
- A PowerPoint presentation is not required
